The delivered food is unloaded onto tables in the Parish Hall, sorted out by item and a week's worth of food is packed by the church and KofC helpers and passed out to families, starting at 1:00 PM, that drive up to the Parish Hall. They remain in their cars or trucks, receive delivery by the helpers and they take off.


