Every September a non-profit organization known as Life Happens coordinates the Life Insurance Awareness Month campaign. Everyone was insured; that was one of those two primary reasons for joining While the Order is now well known for its charitable works and strong advocacy for the most vulnerable, strengthening men in their faith and protecting them and their families with life insurance were twin catalysts in forming the Order. While young Catholic men still seek to strengthen their faith, we know families still need protection from untimely death. This mission remains just as important today. In an attempt to make every member and every eligible Catholic man aware of how important life insurance is, the Order has made a substantial investment. The Order has provided me with a high-tech, state of the art financial needs analysis platform that can help us determine where you stand today. Herb Membership Director Hello Brother Knights,

As your Membership Director, my primary responsible is to help along with the membership to bring in new members for Fraternal Year 2022-2023. Our membership quota is 6% or 10 new members. Thus far we are doing great. On 19 Aug we had a membership ceremony and brought in three new members - SUPER, only seven more to go. In addition to getting seven more members the council must conduct and report programs in each of the four program categories (Faith, Family, Community, and Life) for a total of 16 program credits, with four in each category. We are a great Council and yearly we complete these four program requirements with no problem. End result of all this by receiving seven or more new members we will receive the Star Council Award, Supreme's highest award for recognizing excellence in our council's operation.

What follows is very important information that I provided in last month's newsletter, but because of its importance I would like to reiterate it again: Brothers Knights are asked to start today to help recruit new members. When attending Mass or some other parish function, should you see a new family introduce yourself and tell them about the Knights of Columbus. Being a Knight brings the experience of supporting the church, the community, our families, deepening one's faith and paving a new direction in one's life. Be an active recruiter. New families appreciate being approached and welcomed into the community and you may be very much surprised of your positive results.

Also, important are the benefits of bringing in new members: Recruiters receive 500 points for each new or readmitted member recruited and these points can be redeemed for merchandise from the Supreme Council Supply Department. After the recruitment of two members, the recruiter becomes a member of the Supreme Council's Very Important Proposer's Club (VIP Club) and if you bring in two new members you will receive \$25 for each of the two members and that will pay your next year's dues. Lastly, a new reward has been added: Bring in two new members in a month and you will be entered into a drawing to receive a \$300.00 prize, WOW! And the council will be entered into a drawing for \$100.00. Can our Council receive the Star Council Award for Fraternal Year 2022-2023, working together, you bet we can, AMEN.


Gentlemen, our main means of financial support comes from weekly bingo, and much of it supports charitable organizations, annual scholarships, and the church. We currently have three bingo teams that work normal bingo games every third week from 6:15 to 9:15 PM. We also have some help that works quarter bingo every week from 4:15 to 6:15 PM. It would be wonderful if we could get sufficient help to have a 4th bingo team that would require an additional seven men. One man to sell bingo cards, two men to work the floor validating bingo winners, two bingo callers, one that would work from 6:15 to about 8 PM and the second that would work from 8 PM to 9:15 PM, and a kitchen cook that would work from 4 to 7 PM. Training would be provided as needed. We can also use a backup to support Quarter Bingo, and training for this position would be required. So gentleman, if you can support a maximin of three hours every fourth week that would be wonderful. We had a 4th bingo team, but we lost a team resulting from Job changes, moves and health problems and getting a 4th team back again would be wonderful.
