






THE SAD PASSING AND MEMORY OF BROTHER KNIGHT GARY RILEY

Brother Gary Riley passed away on the 22nd of October 2023 at the age of 71. Gary was born in Chattanooga, TN on the 14th of March 1952. His family moved to St Simons Island when he was 11 and attended school there. Gary was the first child of James and Joyce Riley. Gary has one sister and two brothers, Sandra, Larry, and Ronald, who recently passed away. Both Sandra and Larry were at the memorial Mass held at Our Lady of Victory Church. St. Simons Island is also where Gary met his wife, Margaret. Gary and Margaret spent 51 wonderful years together and shared many lives changing experiences. Gary and Margaret raised three wonderful and successful children, Ryan, Stephen, and Bridget. They were also at the Memorial Mass with their families. Also, there were their four grandchildren Alayna, Gabby, Riley, and Davey. In their later years Margaret and Gary made Crestview, Florida their home, where each of their children graduated from Crestview High School and went on to start their own family.



With Margaret by Gary side, Gary served in the United States Air Force for over 22 years where he obtained the rank of Senior Master Sergent. During those 22 years, Gary worked on many of the Air Force advanced fighter jets, including being the crew chief for the F15 fighter jet. On the flight line Gary was known as, "Thumbs Up Gary".

Gary back on 26 Sep 2001 became an active member of the Knights of Columbus (KofC). For years Gary took on the job of renting the KofC Hall. The rental fees were used to finance the upkeep of the KofC Hall. Gary, also for a few years, before moving to Arizona, took responsibility for quarterly Highway Cleanup where a two-mile stretch of highway had to be cleaned up every quarter. He was responsible for picking up and returning the needed equipment from the city and getting rid of the trash picked up by the Knights and he attended most monthly meetings.

Gary was also a master storyteller. His stories and jokes were always an important part of putting people at ease and bringing people together in any group or situation. He loved

traveling. He used to love riding his motorcycle, Gary also loved to BQ and cooking out in the back yard. Gary was like a master chief on the BQ grill, and sometimes it seemed like he was cooking for all of Crestview.

Gary was enrolled by the KofC as a Perpetual Member in the Missionary Society of St. Columban to share in the Masses, prayers, and work of Columban missionaries

worldwide. All Associate members share in the

following: Each year 2,000 Masses are offered for Associate Members including 100 special Masses at Easter, All Souls and Christmas.

Each week special prayers are offered in all Columban houses and mission centers. Each Day the sacrifices and prayers of Columban missionaries are made.

Gary made such a wonderful impact on so many lives that he will truly be missed!
